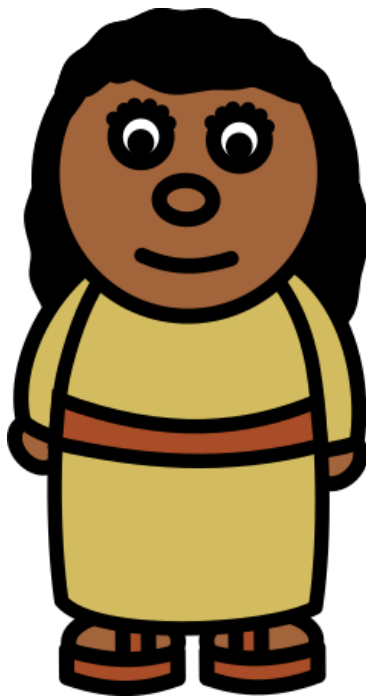


Mystery Museum

Prophet

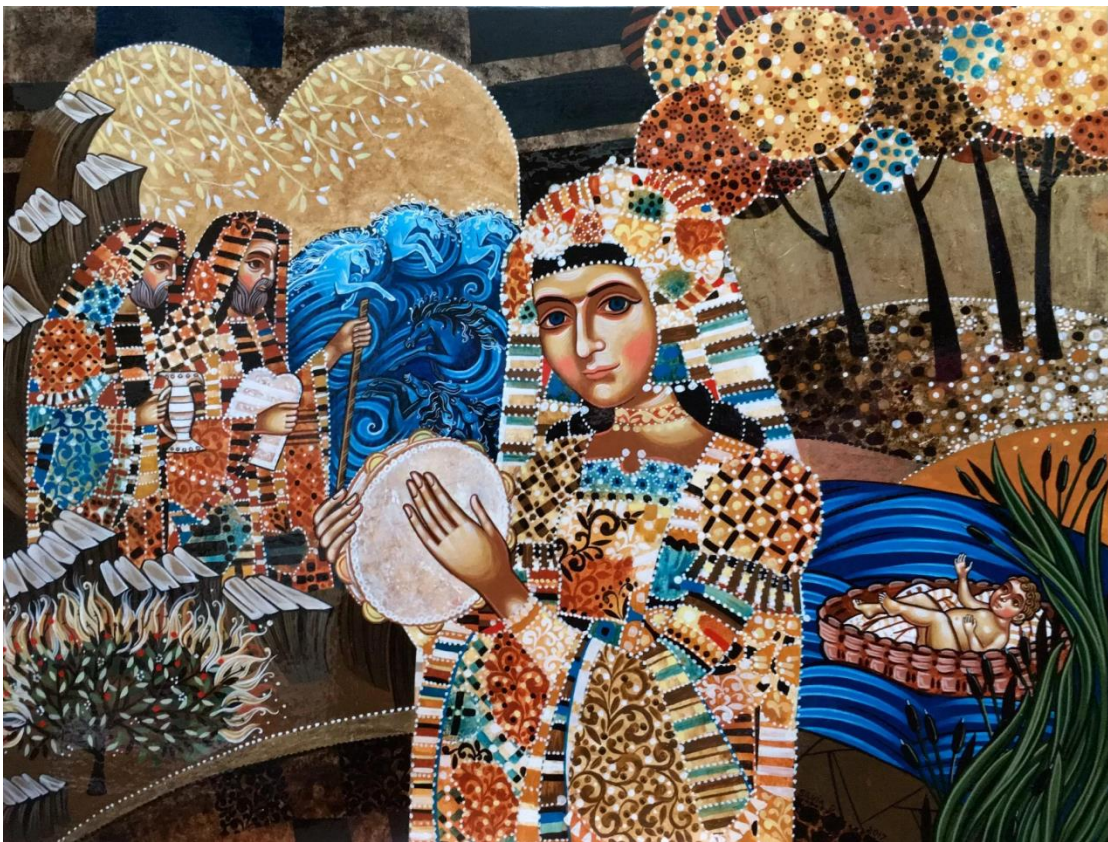
Hi, my name is Miriam

mom and me raise him.



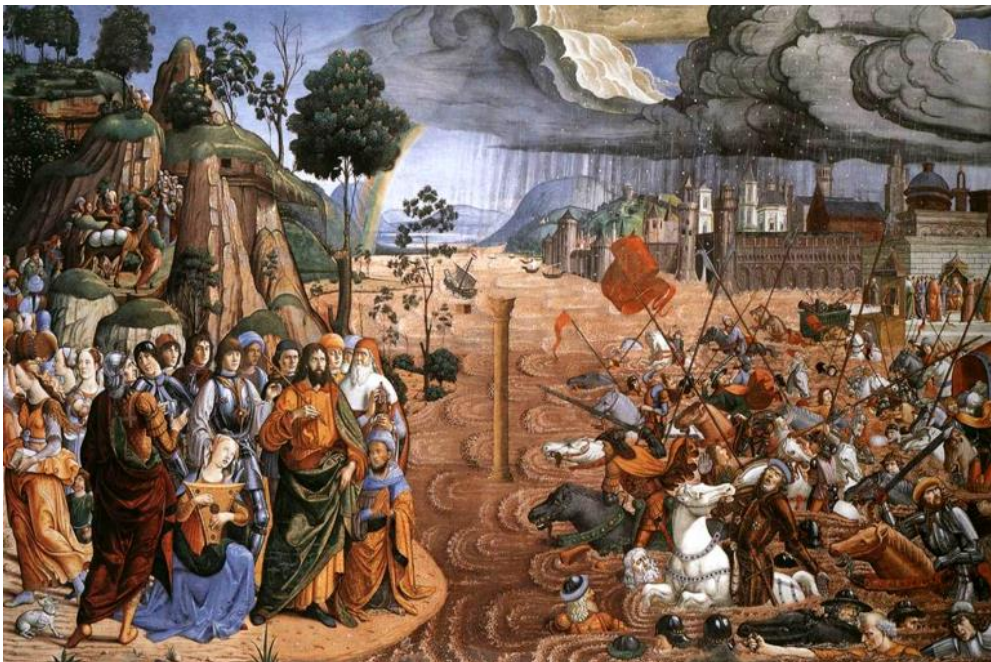
After Moses grew up, he had to run away from Egypt. Many years later, God spoke through the burning bush and sent him back to Egypt.

I know that you are!

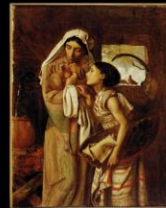
